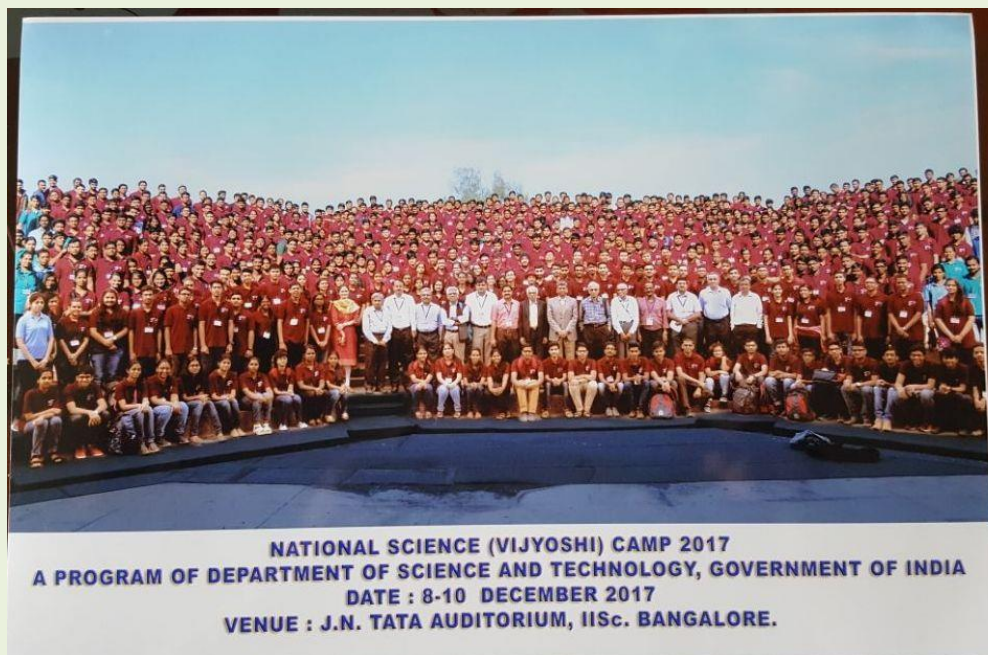


Akshay Shanbhag from TOS participates in the Vijyoshi Camp 2017

The program has been initiated and funded by the Department of Science and Technology, Government of India, to attract exceptionally highly motivated students for pursuing basic science courses and research career in science

As part of the fellowship program, Akshay participated in the Annual National Science (Vijyoshi) Camp held at the All India Institute of Science, Bangalore from Dec 8th to 10th 2017. Hundreds of students attended the camp which included the KVPY Fellows; INSPIRE Scholars (Students of first year B.Sc/BS or Int. M.Sc/MS) from various universities, Students from IISc (first year BS program of August 2017) and selected students from IISERs, IITs, NISER and Central Universities (first year BS /MS program of August 2017).

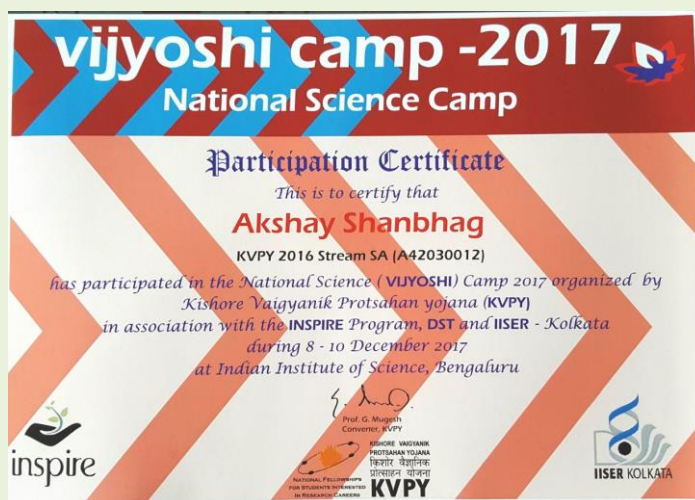


The aim of the Camp was to provide a forum for interactions between bright young students and leading researchers in various branches of science and mathematics.
